#### Assessment of reforms




56% of the population do not see any successful reform in Ukraine

## Fighting corruption population constantly consider as a reform №1




# Citizens do not see success in implementing the main reform - anti-corruption




Only 9% of the population consider the anti-corruption reform in Ukraine to be successful

83% do not consider the fight against corruption successful, 50% of them consider it to be a failure
