

Open Data in Ukraine: opportunities and challenges

A Breakthrough in International Rankings

In 2016 Ukraine has joined the International Open Data Charter.

In 2017, according to the Global Open Data Index (Open Knowledge International), Ukraine ranked 31, having improved on its previous showing by 23 positions compared with the 2016 results.

The Open Data Barometer placed Ukraine 44th, which is an improvement of 18 positions.






A share out of 272 datasets published on data.gov.ua




